6. Spring Sports Update

Mr. Mangan presented school committee members with an update on Spring sports. Mr. Mangan stated that all spring sports will be offered with some modifications such as wrestling to ensure student athletes are spaced out properly and that everyone has an opportunity to practice safely. Students are wearing masks, practicing social distancing as they have been all year. Mr. Mangan thanked the students for adhering to all the guidelines so that everyone could enjoy sports.

7. Special Education Parents Advisory Council (SEPAC)

SEPAC Board members presented the school committee with an update on SEPAC. The explained that the Bedford Special Education Parents Council (SEPAC) serves as a valuable resource for parents, guardians, caretakers and educators of children with disabilities and/or learning challenges as a networking hub to connect with others to share information and offer mutual support. They also explained that all school districts must have a SEPAC group. The board requested the following:

- Collaborative Meeting with the literacy team to provide parent perspective on the district literacy planning headed by Dr. Tricia Clifford.
- Documentation of the process for consistent transparency and delivery of student screening and test scores to parents/caregivers and working on a process to have truant/tardy notices be copied to the special education liaison (in process)
- A presentation to the SEPAC on Bedford's special education process for evaluations (in process)
- Meet with principals, assistant principals, special education administration to establish social inclusion options at each school for students in special education
- Potential development of an American Sign Language class at Bedford High School for 2022-2023 year

8. Superintendent's Report

Mr. Conrad presented to the school committee the following during his Superintendent's Report. Mr. Conrad stated that the commissioner had just released more guidelines in which it was stated that all students need to return to in-person learning by May 17, 2021. Bedford as already returned its students to in-person learning ahead of the date. DESE stated that the class of 2022 will not be required to take MCAS and the certificate of attainment will be transferred after March 20, 2020. Mr. Conrad also mentioned that play could now be used as part of learning and that the principals at Davis and Lane are going over the new guidelines and data for

the best practice for reinstatement. New information from DESE about close contacts. Close contacts within three to six feet will be notified but will not need to quarantine if they were masked and for those people vaccinated this does not apply as long as they followed all other safety protocols. Mr. Conrad congratulated Kevin Tracy on accepting a position as a new principal in the Reading Public School. A search committee will be formed for hiring his replacement. Lane School is in the process of finalizing using Middlesex Community College lot for drop-off and pick-up. Mr. Conrad mentioned color run taking place June 3rd, virtual bingo night, the diversity book club meeting and Lynn Lyons counseling seminars coming up. Per DESE free lunch will continue through the entire school year next year. Students aged 16 -18 can be vaccinated.
