6. 6th Grade Math Presentation

Ms. Pumphrey, Mr. Morrissey and Mr. Hartunian gave a presentation the School Committee members regarding proposed changes to un-level 6th grade Math courses. During the presentation, it was disclosed that the discussion around Math changes began during department meetings at JGMS with regard to course offerings. During those discussions, information was shared that all

current 5th grade students are part of heterogeneous Math groups. After this presentation, a lengthy discussion was had to discuss the impact of removing this particular Math level and the impact on implementation and schedule changes should this course change move forward.

Why move away from Academically Advanced Math

- Too early to label 11 year old students as not being advanced in Math
- 2020-2021 Lane ended leveled Math courses
- Transition to Middle School will improve
- All students to receive differentiated Math class. Which allows students more access to advanced level Math
- No change for Academically Advanced Math in 7th and 8th grade
