Message from Commissioner Riley

Late this morning DESE Commissioner Jeff Riley announced that he will ask the Massachusetts Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to grant him the authority to mandate masks for all public K-12 students, educators, and staff through October 1 to ensure schools fully reopen safely and to provide time for more students and educators to get vaccinated. The mandate would include exceptions for students who cannot wear a mask due to medical conditions or behavioral needs. After October 1, the commissioner's policy would allow middle and high schools to lift the mask mandate for vaccinated students and staff only if the school meets a certain vaccination rate – at least 80 percent of students and staff in a school building are vaccinated. Unvaccinated students and staff would still be required to wear masks. The DESE Board will meet at 10:00am on Tuesday, August 24, 2021 to consider his request. School Committee Meeting Recap

On Wednesday night (8/18/21) the school committee met to consider COVID-19 protocols for the start of the 2021-2022 school year. Thank you to everyone who took the time to share their thoughts with the committee and me. After hearing from community members I recommended to the committee that we continue to encourage everyone who is eligible to become vaccinated, continue to maximize airflow through our HVAC system, continue to use MERV-13 filters in our HVAC system, utilize HEPA filtration machines in all occupied spaces, stock and encourage the use of hand sanitizing stations, participate in DESE's pooled testing program which will include weekly safety check testing, rapid diagnostic testing, and a "test and stay" testing protocol for

close contacts, continue to stock and make available personal protective equipment (PPE) to all, and begin the year with a mask mandate for all students and staff. These protocols, if approved, would allow us to prioritize the health and safety of everyone in our school buildings. The school committee will vote on these recommendations on Tuesday, August 24, 2021 at their next meeting.
