<u>COVID-19 Page, protocols, videos, test and stay sign up, and other COVID-19 information</u> We have added a COVID-19 information page to our website. It can be reached via the yellow banner on the home page or at <u>BPS COVID Information Page</u> The page contains information from DESE, DPH, AAP, and CDC. It also contains a short four minute video that does a great job reviewing the DESE/DPH Guidance for Schools <u>ArxEd COVID Video</u> It also has a link so that you can sign up for our testing program which includes symptomatic testing, routine COVID-19 safety checks, and the "test and stay" program. When you enroll you are automatically enrolled in all three parts of the program. Thank you to the Bedford Department of Health and Human Services for putting our school COVID-19 cases on the town's COVID-19 Statistics Page at <u>Town of Bedford COVID-19</u> <u>Statistics Page</u>

We urge everyone to sign up for the testing program as an additional protective measure. Keep in mind that <u>Test and Stay</u> allows non-symptomatic close contacts to come to school, get tested and if negative go to class. If a child tests positive they are sent home. <u>Symptomatic testing</u> is used when a student starts to have symptoms of COVID-19 at school; students should not

come to school if they are feeling sick while at home. <u>Routine COVID-19 safety checks</u> (previously called Pooled testing) allows students and staff to be tested on a regular basis. This year each of us will be providing two samples so that in the case of a positive pool each individual can be tested in the lab and the positive COVID-19 case easily identified. The samples will be taken via nasal swab at school.

<u>Please keep in mind that to date our test and stay program has not revealed any in-school transmission.</u>

September 11, 2001

Tomorrow is the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks, a solemn day for each of us as individuals and as a nation. On the morning of September 11, 2001, extremists hijacked four airplanes from east coast airports, including our own Logan International Airport. Two of those planes were flown into the twin towers of the World Trade Center, a third hit the Pentagon, and a fourth crashed in Shanksville, Pennsylvania. Nearly 3,000 people were killed during these attacks. Tomorrow we will commemorate this solemn anniversary.
