# <u>Trusted Traveler Program at Hanscom Air Force Base</u>

HAFB announced that beginning on Sunday, April 23, 2023, the 66th Security Forces Squadron on base will implement a <u>Trusted Traveler Program</u>. The program will expedite access for those visiting the installation as guests of service members, dependents, Department of Defense employees, and military retirees, by allowing those with base access to vouch for the occupants in their vehicle. "Being able to facilitate a greater sense of connectedness between the

community and our military families here was a major factor in putting this program into action," said Maj. Brandon Casso, 66 SFS commander. Casso continued, "We're trusting our base community with this program because they understand what it means to live and work on an installation, and they know who should and shouldn't be on the base when it comes to keeping everyone safe."

To be eligible a co-traveler must be a U.S. citizen, have a valid photo ID if over the age of 18, and would otherwise be permitted on the installation per Air Force regulation. Trusted personnel must be in the same vehicle, or mode of transport, as those they're vouching onto the installation. I'm pleased to share that in May, John Glenn Middle School will be the first school in our district to roll out a waste sorting station for students in the cafeteria. Waste sorting separates Liquids, Compostable, and Recyclables from Trash. This program will allow us to reduce what ultimately goes to incineration as "trash". Having been part of a waste sorting program previously I'm confident we will have success here in Bedford! This will allow us to comply with the Massachusetts State Waste Bans, reduce the amount of waste we produce, and protect the environment our students will inherit.
