Superintendent Update

Saturday, January 1, 2022

Hello Bedford School Community,

Happy New Year! I hope that you had a wonderful vacation and that you were able to rest and relax. I am sorry to interrupt you at the end of the week but I am writing to update everyone as we prepare for the return to in-person instruction in all of our schools on Monday, January 3, 2022. We are excited to see everyone back at school on Monday.

Over the vacation week we have had a number of updates from CDC, DESE, and DPH. I will try to go through them so that you can see what effects they will have on all of us.

CDC Isolation and Quarantine changes

CDC has changed its guidance on Isolation protocols. These changes have prompted DESE and DPH to review their isolation and quarantining protocols as well. Isolation is the time someone who is COVID-19 positive must spend in isolation and away from others. The protocol previously was ten (10) days and has been reduced to five (5) days. DESE/DPH has endorsed this change. DESE has updated the isolation and close contact protocols. This information can be found at <u>DESE/DPH Protocols COVID-19 Scenarios Updated 12/30/2021</u>.

Isolation is for anyone regardless of vaccination status who has tested positive for COVID-19. Quarantine is for close contact with a positive COVID-19 individual. The current information from DPH is at <u>About COVID-19 isolation and quarantine</u> and the DESE update is at <u>DESE/DPH Protocols COVID-19 Scenarios Updated 12/30/2021.</u>

If you test positive for COVID-19 (regardless of vaccination status) you should:

- Stay home and remain isolated for 5 Days
- Consider the first day with symptoms or the day you test position as Day Zero (0)
- As long as you have NO SYMPTOMS
 - You may return to school on Day Six (6)
 - Continue to wear a mask around others for an additional five (5) days
 - You have been fever-free without fever-reducing medication for Twenty-Four (24) hours

As a reminder, isolation keeps someone who is sick and has tested positive for COVID-19 away from others (even in their own home) while quarantine keeps someone who is a close contact of someone with COVID-19 away from others.

I hope this information is helpful to you and that will keep us safe.

KN95 masks

Prior to the vacation week DESE provided us with additional KN95 masks. While KN95 masks are not required they are highly recommended for use at this time. The KN95 masks we received will be available at each school.

Please note that masks are required in all of our buildings and that proper use of masks will be particularly important as we reopen our schools on Monday, January 3, 2022.

Antigen tests for faculty and staff

DESE has provided us with Antigen Test Kits for all faculty and staff. These test kits will allow all BPS staff to test prior to the start of school on Monday, January 3, 2022. They have also provided us with KN95 masks that will be available at all schools. <u>DESE Press Release - Tests</u>

School Specific Guidance

With the marked increase of the OMICRON variant of COVID-19 in our community, county, and state please know that everyone is working to ensure that we return to school safely. With that in mind you will hear directly from each building principal tomorrow. Each will alert you to specific changes in their school building to keep faculty and students safe. Most of these changes will be

to the diligence of keeping our guard up through improved mask compliance, the use of masks more well suited to the OMICRON variant, reduced interpersonal contact, and changes to eating arrangements at lunch.

As always, and especially now, I truly believe it is important for all of us to continue working together for the benefit we provide to one another.
