Superintendent Update

Friday, November 6, 2020

Hello Bedford School Community,

This was a shortened week with our day off for Election Day on Tuesday. There was an important flurry of information on Friday afternoon from Governor Baker and Commissioner Riley. Governor Baker announced that Massachusetts will be updating the metric that it uses for how each community's COVID-19 information will be communicated going forward. From now on, the state will use three pieces of information: the number of cases ratio of 1:100,000, the community positivity rate, and the size of the community. These three pieces of evidence will be taken together and used to create the color code for each community.

Veterans Day Reminder

Please note that next Wednesday, November 11, 2020 is Veterans Day. It is a Federal holiday and therefore the schools will be closed and no classes will occur in either the hybrid or remote model. Veterans Day marks the armistice that ended World War I on November 11, 1918. The armistice went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars." In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day with the following words: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations..." Since that time our nation has used this day as a day of reflection for all who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our country. MIAA Guidance

Today the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EEA) released updated guidance to youth and adult amateur sports activities as well as high school sports. These guidelines were created in collaboration with neighboring states including Vermont, Maine, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, and New Jersey.
