MATH MCAS

10th graders will be taking the math MCAS test on May 17 & 18. It is important that students get sufficient sleep and eat a healthy breakfast on testing days. Since this assessment is used to determine competency toward a high school diploma, the DESE does not allow students to make up the test or part of the test without a doctor's note. Technology is NOT allowed at any time during the testing times. Using technology can result in test results being invalidated. Please encourage your student to leave technology at home those days. In addition, please refrain from calling or texting your student. If there is an urgent message, please call the main office.

HEALTHY AND UNHEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS WORKSHOP 4/28/16

On Thursday, April 28, 2016, in the BHS Large Group Instruction room from 6:30-7:30 pm, there will be a workshop on Healthy and Unhealthy Relationships, featuring subject matter experts Julie Youdovin, Outreach and Program Coordinator of Journey to Safety, and Dawn Shewmaker, Family Advocacy Program Assistant, Interim Prevention Specialist.

About this workshop:

Teen dating abuse is an issue that crosses all socioeconomic, cultural, and demographic lines. One in three teens in the US is a victim of physical, emotional, or verbal abuse from a dating partner. This workshops aims to generate community-wide awareness to empower adults to prevent dating abuse, recognize the warning signs of abuse, know how to respond, and to promote healthy and respectful behavior in dating relationships.

ROTC

On May 4, 2016, the US Army Challenge will be at Bedford High School. This event challenges students to complete different obstacles. Students will find themselves relying upon their strength in science, technology, engineering, and math to complete said events. Along the way, the students who succeed will have demonstrated sound STEM and leadership abilities. Some comments from one of the US Army Challenge administrators:

"Strategy Tower" and "Air Lift" obstacles both incorporate strategy, mental agility, and critical thinking. In order to accomplish these tasks quickly and successfully, students must be innovative and able to think on their feet. Please see the attached Activities PDF for reference.

In addition to the two activities mentioned above, students will have an opportunity to interact with our "Strength Match" application. This custom iPad app shows how students' STEM and leadership attributes match up to the strengths of a U.S. Army Soldier. Once students have ranked themselves, their strengths are matched to available careers in the Army—jobs often involving high technologies. Each student will receive their top three matches, and can then share their results via email, text, or social media. This event is planned to occur in the school gym and students are required to register before participating. At no time is a student signing up for the US Army or any other branch of military service. After registering, students are then to print out the GO PASS and bring it to the event. The challenge runs concurrently with the school day.
