Flag Day

On Tuesday, June 14, 2022, we observed Flag Day which is celebrated annually on the fourteenth of June. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States of America on June 14, 1777, by a resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The Flag Resolution stated: "Resolved, That the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; That the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation." In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14th as Flag Day. Juneteenth

On Monday, June 19, 2023, all Bedford Public Schools will be closed as we celebrate Juneteenth, the newest Federal holiday. Juneteenth commemorates the announcement made on June 19, 1865, to tens of thousands of African-Americans in Texas that they had been emancipated, closing the door on one of the last chapters of slavery in the U.S. Juneteenth traces its origins back to Galveston, Texas where on June 19, 1865, Union soldiers, led by Major Gen. Gordon Granger landed in the city with news that the Civil War had ended and enslaved people were now free. The announcement came two-and-a-half years after [President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation](https://www.whitehouse.gov/the-press-office/2013/01/01/2013-01-01-emancipation-proclamation) of Jan. 1, 1863, that freed enslaved people in Confederate states. However, since that proclamation was made during the Civil War, it was ignored by Confederate states and it wasn't until the end of the war that the Executive Order was enforced in the South. Outdoor Track and Field had a strong showing at the State Divisional Meet with four student-athletes qualifying and representing BHS at the Meet of Champions at Fitchburg State

University. Senior Jessica Lin was selected as the Foley Division Player of the Year. Samantha Sheahan, Farrah Scott, Josh Garraway and Andrew Tram were selected as League All-Stars.

The Softball Team won the Foley Division then defeated Westborough and Holliston in the MIAA State Tournament before being eliminated by Tewksbury in the sectional semifinal. Senior Kaylee Grace was selected as the Foley Division Player of the Year. Seniors Lindsey and Nicole Steele were selected to the All-Conference Team and Alice Cooperider, Alexa Masters, and Kate Patterson were selected as league All-Stars.

The Baseball Team finished just shy of qualifying but had many individual highlights including Sophomores Drew Siwik and Ryan Capobianco being selected as DCL All-Stars.

Girls Tennis qualified for the State Tournament and defeated their 1st opponent in North HS from Worcester 5-0 before being eliminated by Scituate HS. in the round of 32. Seniors Danielle DiGangi and Kate Heller were both selected as DCL All-Stars.
