Superintendent Update

Hello Bedford School Community,

I had hoped to open my first letter of 2021 with lighthearted remarks about the end of 2020 and our looking forward to ushering in the new year. However, the events of Wednesday evening in Washington D.C. changed the trajectory of my message. Like so many Americans, I was overcome with sadness for our country. The events in Washington DC were difficult to watch and impossible to believe. My thoughts immediately turned to our teachers and administrators who would be greeting our students on Thursday morning. I sent them a quick message thanking them in advance for the courageous conversations to come. I was grateful that each principal worked with their faculty to provide a moment of reflection and community building. The principals and other colleagues also offered age appropriate resources to help guide those important classroom conversations. This thoughtful approach is so important to our students and families and I am grateful to our faculty and staff for everything that they have been called on to do and the grace with which they do it.

If you are having difficult conversations about Wednesday's events at home the principals have offered you resources to assist in those conversations. I wanted to offer two more resources that may help. The first is an article on how to talk to students about violence from the National Association of School Psychologists. DESE Updates

Commissioner Riley announced flexibility for the Class of 2021 and others by lengthening MCAS and ACCESS assessment windows, pledging to use the MCAS assessment as diagnostic and not for accountability purposes, and to allow seniors to obtain their competency determination with approved coursework. This is very good news, but still places a burden on our schools to conduct in person assessments. We will have more information on that in the upcoming months.

On Wednesday we received word from DESE that school nurses may be moved to Phase I Stage II of the vaccine distribution. For more information about the vaccine distribution process please visit MA Vaccine Info

The Board of Elementary and Secondary Education voted to send the draft updated World Languages Curriculum Framework out for public comment. It includes a commitment to high quality world language programs for all students, regardless of age, ability, or linguistic background; the adoption of the terminology of world languages rather than foreign languages; and the presentation of standards by proficiency level rather than grade level. DESE is accepting feedback on the draft via an online survey until Monday, February 22.
