### The Science of Well-being for Teens FREE Online Course

As many of you know, our RULER program at JGMS is based on the work of Marc Brackett, a professor at Yale University. Dr. Brackett is the founder of Yale's Center for Emotional Intelligence. One of Dr. Brackett's colleagues Dr. Laurie Santos, the professor who created Yale's most popular class *Psychology and the Good Life* has retooled her course into a free online course for teenagers. The six-week course *The Science of Well-being for Teens* uses short videos to highlight common misconceptions about happiness and teaches teens about the behaviors, feelings, and thoughts that produce mental well-being. The course is free and available to all. While I have not taken the course I do expect that many teens and families may be interested in this important topic. # Spring Paving

We've received an alert from the Bedford DPW about the schedule for the first paving project of the year. The paving project will take place on South Road from Railroad Avenue to the south of Hartwell Road. The work is tentatively scheduled to begin on Tuesday, April 18, 2023. The project involves reclaiming (pulverizing) the existing pavement, grading, and putting down the first (binder) course of asphalt. The project should take about a week to complete.
