1. Click on Common app tab and fill out **PROFILE** section.

2. EDUCATION

School:

School Lookup: Click "Find School"

• If Bedford High School is not listed in the pop-up, then type Bedford High School under "School Name" on the left side of the page. Then click "Continue." All of our school information will come up.

Date of Entry: If you started at BHS as a freshman, select September 2012 from the pull down menus.

<u>College and Universities</u>: If you have taken any colleges classes, select the number of schools attended from the drop down menu. Then repeat the steps above. If you have not attended a college or university, select 0 (zero) from the drop down menu.

Course scheduling system: Semester

Course Title: Enter the name of the course and level (Example: British Literature - High Honors)

- Choose Advanced Placement for AP courses
- Choose Honors for Honors (formerly level 4) or High Honors (formerly level 5) classes If you are taking a Standard (formerly level 2) or College Prep (formerly level 3) class, - write the course name followed by the level – do not select a course level choice listed on the Common App. (Example: British Literature – Standard or British Literature – College Prep)
- Choose Dual Enrollment if you are in Psychology or Economics and have been accepted for dual enrollment.

Course Schedule: Full year unless you are taking Health and PE which are semester courses.

Honors: Here you can list National Honor Society, Department Award(s), etc...

• Select the number of honors you would like to report (if none, select 0 (zero), select grade level, and highest level of recognition.

Future Plans: Select your career interest from a drop down menu and then select the highest degree you would like to earn.

3. TESTING

Tests Taken:

- Here you can chose whether you want to self-report standardized test scores.
- Please note: you must also send official tests scores through College Board or ACT.
- Click on the box to see options and select the tests you would like to report (you can select more than one).
 - o Example: SAT's, SAT Subject Tests, ACT's, AP's
 - A list of the tests you selected will show in that box and at the bottom of the page.
 - Select the number of times you took the test as well as the number of times you expect to take the test in the future. You do not need to report every test date.
 - Report your scores (if applicable) along with the dates you have taken (or plan to take) the exams.

International Students: You do not need to complete this section unless you are an international applicant. If this is the case, please see your counselor.

4. ACTIVITES: Here you will list your activities (up to 10) and answer all the prompts for each activity.

5. WRITING:

<u>Personal Essay</u>: Some colleges require submission of the personal essay with your Common Application. You may submit a personal essay to any college, even if it is not required by that college. If not required by a college, you will be given the option during submission to include your essay or not for that college.

- Click the box next to "I understand."
- The Common App will list colleges that require an essay and those that do not require an essay.
- Please note the word minimum (250) and maximum (650). Your essay must fit into this length.
- Select the essay prompt you wish.

<u>Disciplinary History</u>: Read both questions and answer yes or no. If yes, you will need to write an explanation (up to 400 words).
