7. SY25 Draft District Calendar- 1st read & vote

Superintendent Chuang and the committee discussed the proposed FY25 calendar. No major objections or concerns were raised. Mr. Chuang did bring to the committees attention that due when the holidays fall next year it was necessary to extend the usual break by a few days. A few minor edits were suggested. No vote taken.

FY25 Budget Presentation

Superintendent Chuang presented his proposed FY25 Budget to the School Committee. Mr. Chuang highlighted some of the following areas during his presentation. A more in depth line by line presentation will be presented at the next School Committee meeting.

- Uphold the high standard of excellence and inclusive access to educational opportunities
- o Position the district to attract and retain a high quality educator workforce
- The proposed FY25 budget is \$49.5M and includes a \$2.8M increase, which is a 6% increase from FY24.
- The creation of a Special Education Stabilization Fund of \$950K for multi-year use
- A one-time reserve fund transfer of ~\$210K for one-time costs related to the new literacy program
- FY25 Budget Enrollment Planning
- Lower elementary enrollment projected again in FY25 (an estimated decrease of 18 students)
- To meet SC class size guidelines, Davis will require 24 classrooms (an increase of 1 class) and Lane will need 23 classes (a decrease of 2 classes)
- Secondary enrollment increases by an estimated 11 students
- School Committee established class size guidelines are maintained

8. Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Chuang spoke about the recent hate/violence that took place at JGMS. Mr. Chuang stated that all events such as this one are taken very seriously, investigated and used as teachable moments for both students and staff. Events such as these are very disappointing. More information will be shared in his Friday letter.

9. Chair's Remarks

School Committee Chairperson, Mr. Brosgol informed the other members of the School Committee and the public at large, that he would recuse himself from all negotiations involving bargaining units A and B moving forward as a member of his family was part of the current negotiations. Mr. Brosgol also stated that he would not be running to maintain his seat on the School Committee so he may pursue a position as a Select Board Member.

10. Adjournment

Ms. Mehta-Green made the following motion: To adjourn the meeting at 9:40 PM into Executive Session to discuss strategy with respect to Unit A and Unit B Contract Negotiations with the Bedford Education Association. Not to reopen to the public.
